N.Z. NOTES and COMMENT

(By Campbell Paterson)

"The Postage Stamps of New Zealand"—Volume II.

I have just received my copy of the new volume from the Royal Society. (Incidentally the Secretary of the "Royal" appeals to all who do not yet have their copies not to write asking why—the binding is being done as quickly as possible, but it will be some time yet before all orders can be filled.)

I will not attempt a detailed review of the book—for one thing, it will take me weeks properly to digest the wealth of information. Again, as is well known, the contributors of the various chapters are all leaders in their chosen fields and have produced their customary masterly work. Facile praise or criticism based on a few hours' study would be useless and indeed presumptuous. Sufficient it is to say that the new work is obviously a very worthy supplement to its famous companion Volume I. Together they form a record of New Zealand's stamps which must excite the admiration and envy of collectors of other countries less ably served. All the contributors and particularly the co-editors, Messrs R. J. G. Collins and C. W. Watts, have richly earned the thanks and congratulations of all New Zealand specialists.

As one who has been and still is, in the throes of editing, I have a very keen appreciation of what lies behind such a work.

George VI New Varieties — Reports by Mr F. J. Mohr.

3d Chestnut Plate 133—Very slight shifts are seen on 1/12, 3/23 and 4/2, while re-touching of the inner frame lines is seen on a number of stamps, the best examples being 5/11, left inner frame; 5/24, top inner frame; 9/1, right inner frame. 5/24 and 9/1 are both visible to the naked eye.

1d Plate 123—Some very slight shifts, nothing of note.

1½d Plate 121—No varieties noticed.

6d Plate 92—No varieties noticed.

3d Plate 101—Nothing worth while.

2d Plate 82—7/11 very slight shift of background lines above head; 9/24, a series of eight small dots at bottom right corner.

1½d Plate 130—Some very slight shifts on 1/11; 1/13, 1/16, 5/9, 5/23, 6/1, 7/1. 5/23 is perhaps the best, but is only "fair." It shows as a horizontal shift in the top right panel.

1d Plate 124—7/1 has weak top right corner and 9/10 has a doubling of the top curves something akin to 10/13 on Plate 117. Like the latter, it is only a small shift.

1d Plate 125—A shift on 7/1 (top left panel) is describable as "fair" and another, very slight, occurs on 10/2, top right panel. As previously reported in part,

cracking of the plate is suggested by irregular lines between 5/11 and 6/11; 9/9 and 9/10; 10/10 to 10/13; 10/18 to 10/21.

1545 Health Varieties:

Mr Mohr has made an interim report on some varieties seen in the Peter Pan Health. These notes are based on a limited study only and are not a complete record of the whole issue.

1d + ½d Value—Nothing noted in a study covering Centre Plate A and Frame Plates 1 and 2 (leaving Centre Plate B still to be studied).

2d + 1d Value:

Centre Plate B—Nothing noted. Centre Plate A—Not studied.

Frame Plate 1—Slight shifts noticed on 3/9, 4/1, 5/1, 9/3, 11/3.

Frame Plate 2—Slight shifts on 1/8, 6/2, 7/1, 9/3, 10/3, 12/3. Row 7 No. 3 is definitely interesting. There is a slight shift at the top left corner and in addition there is noticeable evidence of retouching to the innermost series of tiny horizontal lines which form the frame shading in this corner. Once seen, this retouching becomes obvious to the naked eye.

Sight Sorting the 1935-47 Pictorials—

3d Maori Girl

This is one of the easiest stamps of the set to sort, as there was only one issue in each of the Single and Multiple watermark groups. It is again a matter of separating the two by the mesh, if possible, or alternatively by use of the watermark detector. The mesh is always vertical for the Single watermark and horizontal for the Multiple. Once separated, the "Single" group should be checked for inverted watermarks, which are scarce. In the "Multiples," inverted watermarks again occur, though not common, and there are several fine re-entries to be found. These latter are excellent examples and scarce, as they appeared very late in the life of the plate and are seldom seen.

DOES SPECIALISATION PAY?
