George VI Re-entry 1d Green.

Corporal G. Read calls my attention to a nice re-entry on Row 10 No. 3 of Plate 120. It is, I think, the equal of any other in this value and is very similar in type to the 3d 8/5 Plate 45. It shows as a doubling upwards of the background lines to the left of the King's head and on the forehead. As the stamp is at the bottom right in a Plate Block of six from Plate 120, most specialists will have it in their collections.
