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1970 PICTORIALS - SOME NEW DISCOVERIES

The 1970 Pictorials seem destined to go out with something of a bang!
Jim Shaw has filed this report comprising some of the latest discoveries.
Included is one which represents a "first" for NZ Philately and another which must be one of the most spectacular of missing colours.

1¢ "Red Admiral" A fine offset has been found affecting two of the colours - the Black and the Buff background. Three stamps were affected one fully and two partially in the sheet value corner.

4¢ "Puriri Moth" Booklets Issue Recently four complete booklets were found in which one of the 4¢ panes was stitched upside-down (i.e. through the right-hand selvedge).

The obvious explanation is that one sheet was placed in the pile upsidedown before guillotining and stitching into individual booklets. so good. Closer examination, however, revealed that the upside-down pane had one of the colours printed upside-down. Each of the four 4¢ booklet panes, therefore, included six stamps with the Dark Green (wing veins) actually printed upside-down. This is a first for NZ stamps to our knowledge and will surely be one of the most sought-after and rare of all the varieties of the series.

10¢ "Royal" Stamp A sheet seen recently showed the two bottom rows (and row eight partially) with the Light Blue omitted.

Editors note:

We have recently seen a complete sheet of this stamp with the Silver colour totally omitted and a second sheet with the top four rows Silver omitted. 140 copies in all.

18¢ "Maori Club" Approximately half a sheet of this stamp was found with the Black (carving on the Club and "New Zealand") totally omitted a striking variety.

Editors note:

We have seen a complete sheet of this stamp with the Black colour shifted upwards to the extent that it encroaches on the stamp above. A most odd and spectacular variety.

FULL FACE QUEENS THE FIRST AND SECOND COLONIAL PRINTINGS BY J. RICHARDSON - USED

Richardson must have been a master of his craft. Working in relatively primitive conditions in early colonial Auckland he produced, between the years 1855 and 1861 stamps of a quality never bettered in all NZ issues since. Quite an achievement really when you think of the obstacles he must have contended with. Irregular or even non-existent paper supply of variable "hand made" quality and inks of similar description. But here they are, the RICHARDSON PRINTS of the Full Faces - a brilliant living testimony to one man's perseverance, experimentation and skill over a century ago. They should be represented in your NZ collection.

The appearance of the stamps in the following offers is almost without exception superb. Faults, some minor, some major - but none too disfiguring - allow us to offer these great rarities to you at managable prices.
