NEW ZEALAND NOTES AND COMMENTS by WARWICK PATERSON

6¢ CRESSET ROSE DEFINITIVE .

Two new plates have appeared in this issue and the details are similar to those already noted in the 7¢ and 8¢ value of the current definitives. New plate numbers are 2A2A2A2A2A and 2B2B2B2B2B and again the new perforation is 14½ x 13½ (original plates 14½ x 14½): The sheet format is 2B on the left 2A on the right perforating from left to right (formerly 1A on the left 1B on the right perforating from the top vertically). Close examination of the new plates suggests to me that, as with the 7¢ reprint (Juhe NL) not merely new plates but new origination (art work) has been used. The print is now much clearer and finer (particularly in the lettering) and I detect minor differences in the size of certain letters notably the length of the "¢" of "6¢". Once again the selvedge markings are quite different (note the value blocks). Examination of the new plates reveals some excellent "naked eye" flaws and retouches. I felt the following were worthy of inclusion in a specialist study.

Plate 2A Row 3/8 Retouch lower left outer margin.

Retouch bottom left corner inner margin.

Retouch bottom left corner margin.

Row 1/7 and Row 1/10 Prominent retouches top left corner margin.

Row 3/8 Retouch lower left corner margin.

Plate flaws or scratches outside lower left margin.

Row 9/9 "Screen dots" flaw in red top right corner.

Plate scratch in red over "w" of "New".

8¢ JOSEPHINE BRUCE

Mr. Goose of Upper Hutt has shown me a plate block (plate 1A) in which Row 10/5 shows a spectacular partial missing red. By chance the plate number is missing also a fact that confirms the bonafides of the variety.

1963 HEALTH PRINCE ANDREW 3d + 1d

Mr. Mervyn W. Lynch has shown me a copy of the miniature sheet in this value with complete offset on the back - a lovely and highly spectacular item - unique to my knowledge. It will be listed in the CP Catalogue.

7¢ plus 1¢ "Is it a bird? is it a plane - no! it's superhorse."

8¢ plus 1¢ "Rural dreamer" 10¢ plus 1¢ "The Innocents have found their next victim " - well - they're colourful as usual, but whether even the children will appreciate the designs this year is an open question. Somehow if the figures in the designs resembled real N2 children one could overlook the heavy sentiment and stylised paraphernalia, but these kids look to me like fugitives from some 1930's "Girls Own" annual. Enid Blyton would surely have approved. Alas, the Healths series has fallen on hard times. Varieties:-7¢ plus 1¢ Plate IBIBIBIB Row 9/4 The boy has had a fright. The face is distinctly paler than in all other copies. 8¢ plus 1¢ Plate IBIBIBIB Row 5/2 malformed "EA" of "Health". Value tablet plate IB shows the sheet value in error as \$.900 and lA is correct at \$9.00. Miniature sheets The stamps from these attractive sheets will be distinguishable from those from the main sheets in that the mesh of the mini sheets is vertical to the designs and in the main sheets - horizontal (observation - our colleagues in Woking). 15¢ Maori Fish Hook At last the last of the NZ stamps with watermark has run out and this Issue is now appearing on unwatermarked paper with blue gum.

THE NEW STANLEY GIBBONS PART 1 (1977)

The second most important event in the New Zealand Philatelic Calendar is the appearance of Stanley Gibbons Catalogue. The proliferation of issues is evidenced by the number of pages in the volume this year - 942 as against 890 in the 1976 Catalogue and in a tacit acknowledgement of the unpredictable nature of the 11 sterling these days the currency conversion tables have been dropped. Items of particular note are as follows (all price information in sterling) Full Face Queens

Such increases are typical and some are even heavier e.g.

at these prices incidentally both items may still be undercatalogued certainly the greater rarity of SG3 Bisect on cover is not reflected by the
25% price difference over SG6. Pin perfs, serrates and roulettes seem to be
well up this year and the "mainstream" Davies star watermark imperfs are
increased overall. The pattern is quite recognizable in this group around about 50% increase across the board except for some of the hugely
priced rarities. Once can scarcely argue with any of these increases whatever method SG use to arrive at them.

Several stamps which have become almost unobtainable in the local (NZ) market lately still seem undercatalogued to me in SG:Examples -

Many of the recent scarce commemoratives seem to lag - many of the prices would serve as dealers buying prices here in NZ and good old O96 8d Red Brown Official Geo V appears again at 65.50 < 5.50.

(Note: The current conversion rate for sterling to NZ Dollars is about \$1.75 to the \$1. Not an adventurous revision this year I'm afraid with the most realistic section being the Full Faces.


