## 20¢ on 7¢ ROSE SURCHARGE

This issue appeared on a reprint of Plates 2A(5) and 2B(5) showing two pink dots vertically above the colour blocks in the lower left selvedge. The paper, gum and perforations are similar to the original printings. The original "VALUE \$7.00" has been obliterated by a narrow black strip with "VALUE \$20.00" to the left of it. The obliterating and the overprinting have been carried out by the photogravure process.

However, there is an innovation. In the top selvedge of the 2A(5)'s there is an additional autotron, a black one at the left end, whereas the plate block contains the original five cylinder numbers. This indicates the use of an extra cylinder to print the black surcharges only, at the time the reprint sheets were printed. In fact there must have been another black cylinder to overprint the 2B(5) sheets at the same time as the "Rose" sheets were printed in tandem, the "B" sheets to the left of the "A" sheets. Obviously, it was a special reprinting of the sheets complete with surcharges.

The other cylinders were the original ones used for the first 2A(5) and 2B(5) sheets, the following flaws reappearing on the reprints.

### Plate 2A(5)

Row 4/3 Light frame flaw  
below "W" and "Z"  
Row 5/9 Long flaw to left  
of "7"  
Row 10/1 Bite out of petal  
at right

### Plate 2B(5)

Row 8/1 Pale patch in  
top of left frame  
Row 8/5 An orange touch-up  
or retouch to the top  
left petal

No variations in the individual surcharges have been seen to date and the colour is an even black.

First indications were that there would be limited supplies only of 2B(5) sheets but Wanganui reports that there are now ample stocks from both plates.

## NZ NOTES - BY WARWICK PATERSON

1935 PICTORIALS

ld. KIWI The booklet panes from Die 3 - the disputed re-entry stamps. Jack Whincop of Napier has shown me a pane from this issue (L2d) containing an example at position 6 which bears all the characteristics of Die I and differs from the other five stamps in the pane in that they all show several officially acknowledged Die III flaws. These are (a) a prominent line of colour through right hand stars to the "D" of "land": (b) prominent flaw to the left of cabbage tree and others. What has never been officially acknowledged is that this No. 6 stamp with its pale Die I sky shading was in fact a re-entry on the booklet plate using the Die I transfer roller (there are other panes from Die 3 booklet plate with the same characteristics - one even contains three "Die I" stamps).

This pane, then, is offered by Mr. Whincop as irrefutable proof of the re-entered Die I impressions on this Die 3 booklet plate. He suggests that even if the original Die I transfer roller had been destroyed (see Handbook Vol. VI, p.90) another roller may have been made from the Die I master die and used in error in the L2d booklet re-entries. This supports CP's original contention about this stamp and the fact that the five other impressions are so different from the sixth, containing as they do so many Die 3 features, is a strong vindication of the "Die I re-entry" theory. We can offer this proving pane this month at \$150.

KING EDWARD VII 1d. GREEN Publicity was recently given in the British Philatelic press to two copies of this stamp with inverted "OFFICIAL" overprint, that is, with the overprint reading downwards.

Our firm's name was mentioned several times in the article concerned and our attention has been drawn to the possibility that, if read in isolation, the article might convey the impression that we viewed the "variety" favourable. In fact, the converse is the case. NZ Bulletin subscribers may recall that the subject was discussed at some length (May and June 1977 and April 1980) and our conclusion, which was published and made known to the author of the recent article, was that the overprints were probably bogus.

To make our stance quite clear, this remains our considered opinion, based on all the evidence available to us.
