EDITORIAL.

The September meeting of the Society was held on the 28th at the Kingsley Hotel with the President, Mrs. Margarete Erskine, in the Chair.

Apologies from members unable to attend the meeting were received from Messrs. Taylor, Garnett and Korel.

It was announced that the date fixed for the Annual General Meeting of the Society would be Saturday, November 26th at 2.30 p.m. at the Kingsley Hotel.

The President next invited Mr. Gordon Kaye to give his talk and display on some of the Full Faces. The first part of the display consisted of a selection of Maori War Covers used on different dates during the campaign, one from Drury, a military strong point 22 miles South of Auckland, pen cancelled 6th June 1862, others on September 3rd '66, March 63 and Headquarters on 16th November 1864 and 8th July 1865, one from OTAHUHU with 5 above and A beneath dated November 4th 1863.

Mr. Kaye announced that more information was required by Mr. R.M. Startup of New Zealand on the "Province of Auckland" postmark which was used by small detachment of troops stationed in the North Island.

The final part of the display Mr. Kaye entitled "The mystery of the Full Face 1d. Bright Orange and Dull Orange Printings on Large Star Paper". The discourse was based on an article published in the "Philatelic Journey of Great Britain" and, as space in this A.G.M. number of the KIWI is limited it is hoped that this interesting article will be published in the next issue of the KIWI.
