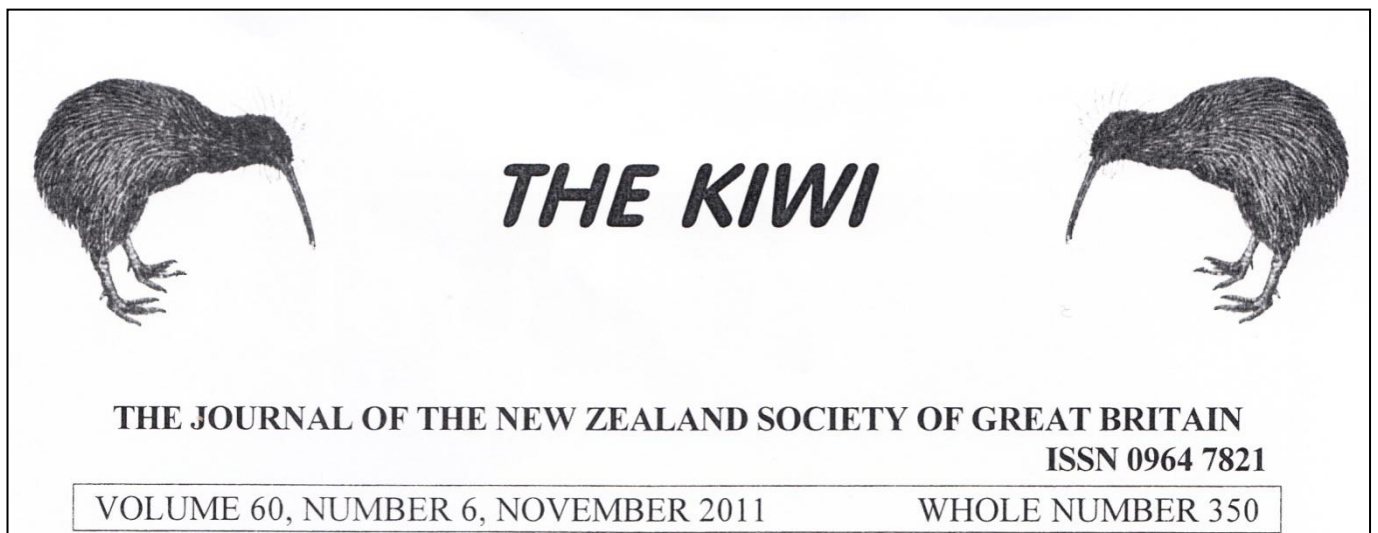

1. INTRODUCTION

In late 1951, P. Alvin Hewett took the first steps to found a Stamp Society in the United Kingdom to 'deal with the stamps and postal history of New Zealand'. The inaugural meeting was held in Mr. H.F. Johnson's office on January 23rd, 1952. Hugh Bramsdén FRPSL was elected first president.

It was soon apparent that a newsletter was an essential requirement of the new society and the first issue of *The Kiwi* appeared in April 1952. It was edited by RW Lees.

The first issue contained mostly parochial society information although Hugh Bramsdén contributed a note on the second Pictorials with a short list of varieties. By the second issue, in May 1952, serious information was published with ECM Moore writing on the 1d Universals and F. Stacey Hooker on the Chalon Heads.

Over the years, the Journal has fulfilled four main functions: first, it has provided the 'glue' that has held the Society together. Comparatively few members attend the meetings and the communication provided by the Journal has been and remains crucial to the Society's continuing success. Secondly, information of interest to members is published. This includes NZ Post Media Releases, Reviews of recently published New Zealand philatelic literature and information about forthcoming events. Thirdly, it provides an opportunity for members to raise questions. On many occasions, an apparently simple question has caused a fascinating debate. Fourthly, there are original articles. As is apparent from The Index, the whole range of New Zealand philately has been covered. Additionally, there have been articles of general interest about New Zealand including a series on the National Parks and a series containing extracts from Captain Cook's Journal.

In the early years, the pattern of publication was somewhat irregular with the number of issues per volume varying between 8 and 3. In 1961, the current pattern was established of 6 issues per volume. The exception was 1971 when there were only 5 issues. Other notable changes to the format have been in 1967 when Graham Monk became Editor and the pages in the whole Volume were numbered sequentially. In 1991, the 40th Anniversary issue (40.3) was the first to be saddle stitched, that is, stapled in the spine. In 1998, the size changed to the more usual A4.

The Kiwi has been fortunate with its Editors over the years. Most have been long serving with Albert Hard being in office for 9 years and Eric Barton for nearly 5 years. The doyen, of course was the late Allan P. Berry who served between January 1975 and November 1996. A total of 131 issues. Under his guidance, the Journal took its place as an established member of the philatelic literature world.

The first edition of the Index was published in 2001 and included the contents of the first 50 volumes. This new edition extends the coverage by 10 years and is published to mark the 60 Anniversary of the New Zealand Society of Great Britain.

2. INDEXING PHILOSOPHY

2.1 INTRODUCTION:

Indexing is, by its nature a little idiosyncratic. The aim of this publication is to allow easy access to the wealth of information that has been published in *The Kiwi*, the Journal of the New Zealand Society of Great Britain during its first 50 years. The early numbers present a particular difficulty because there was little consistency about the organisation and presentation of material. I have tried to index all items that might prove to have continuing interest for later collectors of New Zealand stamps.

2.2 INDEXED:

The following material has been indexed:

Annual Author Index and Index of Contents

Annual General Meeting: Minutes of the AGM including annual list of officers.

Annual Society Programme

Articles: all articles indexed. If reprinted from other publications, marked by (R) after entry

Awards to Members: awards to members in National and International Competitions are indexed.

Datestamps: all special datestamps are indexed as either Anniversary or Commemorative.

Editorials: indexed if containing significant information or giving rise to further comment.

Meeting Reports: all meeting reports with significant philatelic information have been indexed.

Philatelic Literature: all reviews of books etc. are indexed.

2.3 NOT INDEXED:

The following material has not been indexed:

Advertisements: unless the advertisements contain significant philatelic information.

Agenda for AGM

Auction List and Realisations: some of the early auction lists were included in *The Kiwi*. Latterly, published separately.

Editorials: unless containing significant information or giving rise to further debate.

Internal Society Items: purely internal society information, such as changes to Packet Rules, have not been indexed.

Meeting Reports: meeting reports with no significant philatelic information have not been indexed. A number of meeting reports contain lists of displays with little detail as to their contents. This is especially so with the Regional meetings. Details of these meetings will be found in the annual index of contents which has been published since Volume 24 (1975).

Membership Lists & Changes: changes to the membership of the society are contained at the beginning of each issue.

Notification of displays by members

Officers: the Annual List of Officers has not been indexed as it is contained in the Minutes of the AGM.

Regulations: Society regulations for Auctions and Competitions have not been indexed unless significant changes are contained.

Stamp Exhibitions: publicity for Stamp Exhibitions.

Stamp Issuing Programme: in some years, the NZ Post stamp issuing programme was published: this have not been indexed.

Treasurer's and Packet Secretary's Financial Reports: these have sometimes been included in *The Kiwi* but are usually published separately.

3. NAVIGATING THE INDEX:

3.1 The Index

The Index is divided into 7 Sections:

1. New Zealand Stamp Issues
2. New Zealand Postal Stationery
3. New Zealand Postal History
4. New Zealand Related Philatelic Items
5. New Zealand Society of Great Britain
6. New Zealand Non-Philatelic Items
7. Non-New Zealand Related Items.

Within Section 1, Definitives are first listed in chronological order, next, Commemoratives by year of issue followed by other stamp issues.

For Sections 2 and 3, General Articles are listed first, thereafter the topics are in alphabetical order. For each topic, except Military History, sub-divisions follow alphabetically. Military History sub-divisions are listed chronologically.

For Sections 4, 5, 6 and 7, the topics are in alphabetical order as are the sub-divisions within each topic.

Within each Section, Topic / Sub-Division, Articles are usually listed in alphabetical order. The exception is that articles related to each other are listed together. Series of articles by the same author on the same subject are also listed in chronological order. Articles related to each other are also indexed together: for example, an Editorial giving rise to three follow up articles will be listed as Editorial followed by the three articles in chronological order.

A number of contributions contain comments on a number of different topics. Citations have been entered under each topic referred to. Similarly, a number of articles, especially some meeting reports, contain reference to a number of contributions but with no significant philatelic interest: these have not been indexed.

Where appropriate, an explanatory note about the subject content follows the relevant entry in *italicised* script.

3.2 Layout of the Index:

Topics: the order of listing is:

- Meeting Reports
- General Articles
- Specific aspects such as Individual Values etc.

3.3 Additional Information:

Modifiers: some articles include modifiers to assist the reader.

Series of articles on the same subject have the part number in [x] after the entry.

Articles with illustrations have **(I)** after the entry

Articles originally printed in other publications have **(R)** after the entry.
